Full Conference Registration

Registration for the full conference covers your choice of all interest sessions, reading sessions, and music packets.

Wednesday evening concert is free.

Lodging, breakfast, lunch, and dinner are not included in the registration fee.

Early Registration (postmarked by June 1, 2006) is \$225 for the full conference. The fee for three or more people from the same church is \$175/person.

Regular Registration (postmarked by June 2, 2006 or later) is \$250 for the full conference. The fee for three or more people from the same church is \$200/person.
