PERCUSSION METHODS

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MUS 1119-01 Percussion Methods T/TH 9-9:50, Rm. 118

Objective

The purpose of this course is to familiarize future music educators in the various methods of teaching percussion. Emphasis will be placed on teaching and performing aspects within the different percussion instrument families. Students will learn to integrate these aspects into junior high and high school level percussion instruction.

The course is NOT designed to produce a class of virtuoso percussionists. It is, however, necessary to gain a basic and fundamental knowledge of how to play each instrument presented over the course of the semester.
